Initial Deployment #1

Just as it appeared that Thirty-nine Million of the moral majority had failed to say so by not exercising our right to vote, the enemy changed the rules. The far-left politicians were empowered to do their treachery by our silence. We are only moral if we say so, and we are only the majority when we vote.
